And by this I will know that You have shown kindness to my master.”<sup>15</sup> And it happened, **before he had finished speaking**, that behold, Rebekah, who was born to Bethuel, son of Milcah, the wife of Nahor, Abraham’s brother, came out with her pitcher on her shoulder.



**Genesis 24:27** And he said, “Blessed be the LORD God of my master Abraham, who has not forsaken His mercy and His truth toward my master. As for me, being on the way, **the LORD led me to the house of my master’s brethren.**”


**Genesis 24:34** So he said, “I am Abraham’s servant.”





**Genesis 24:49** “Now if you will deal kindly and truly with my master, tell me. 


**Ephesians 1:9** having made known to us the mystery of His will, according to His good pleasure which He purposed in Himself,
